- One staff member from the child care facility must **successfully complete the Protecting Children's Environmental Health E-Course**. The course is offered in English and Spanish on the ProSolutions platform and has been approved for adult learning clock hours.

#### Fees

The 2-year endorsement processing fee:

Facilities that submit for renewed endorsement before their current one expires will receive a \$10 refund of their endorsement fee once a submitted application is reviewed and processed.
